For this challenge we would like you to invent/design a machine. You might like to design a machine that would help look after our environment. Please share your ideas with us. We can't wait to see them!












World Down Syndrome Day is observed every year on March 21st to create awareness about Down Syndrome. On March 21, 2024, the world will come together to celebrate World Down Syndrome Day, a day dedicated to raising awareness, promoting inclusion, and advocating for the rights of individuals with Down Syndrome. The 21st day of March was selected to signify the uniqueness of the triplication (trisomy) of the 21st chromosome which causes Down Syndrome. The message for World Down Syndrome Day 2024 is "End the Stereotypes"

In school each year we wear colourful odd socks on this day to raise awareness and start conversations. This year will be no different so get your most colourful odd socks ready for Thursday 21st March. Remember your school uniform should be as normal except for the socks.

Wearing odd socks is a campaign to raise awareness for World Down's Syndrome Day. Request for Support

The school office would be extremely grateful if you could leave your child's full name, class, year group, reason for absence and when you would expect them to return to school (where possible) when reporting an absence. Please could you inform school on each day of absence unless it has already been made clear that the child will be off for a specified period of time. The office have received many emails and voice messages lately giving just the child's first name. This is very difficult as quite often there are a number of children with the same forename in a school of our size and we are then unable to inform the class teacher quickly and efficiently of their absence. We really appreciate your support in trying to remember to do this.

PE Kits and Absence from PE

These are still causing us a lot of lost PE curriculum time due to children turning up without appropriate kit and teachers having to supply them with spare kit. As children get older, they are also more reluctant to accept and wear spare kit but it is essential that they are dressed correctly for PE. We again would be really grateful that you ensure your child is bringing PE kit. Teachers will be handing out reminder slips to children over the coming weeks if they are saying that they do not have kit in school.

If your child is unable to do PE for an appropriate reason, then please could you send a <u>signed note</u> to the class teacher to inform them of the reason for their non-participation. PE is an essential curriculum lesson for all pupils and children should only be missing this for a very good reason.

We loved it when our teachers shouted "drop everything and read!" and get even got some juice and sweets whilst we read.










Yl have been working on their numbers to 50 this week.

We explored our favourite texts, wrote book reviews and even listened to a Scandinavian tale called 'The Babayaga'!
















We had a great time on World Book Day, sharing books, suggesting books for others and enjoying reading. We made our own stories and ally told each other our tales.
















In Science, we have been looking at sound, how we hear and how sound travels through different mediums. We also looked at how good different materials are at insulating sound. The fluffy materials were best!

Its a shame they wont have grown in time to make our Woolton pie this week!






