Dear Overleigh Family,

Thank you to all the children for their wonderful efforts, and to the parents, carers and teaching staff who have supported them throughout the build up/revision process and during test week. We look forward to continuing to support our Y6s in the remaining time at the school, both academically and socially, in being ready for the next stage of their education.





It is now the turn of our Year 1s and Year 4s to follow that lead and excel in their phonics and times tables tests respectively. Please keep up your reading skills over the half-term, particularly if you are in Year 1/2 and keep firing

those multiplication questions to our Year 4s so they are both in the best possible place to achieve to their highest standard.



There are also a lot of lovely events upcoming in the Summer Term including Sports Days, our Y6 performance and leavers' service, a number of trips, our last few class assemblies and our Nursery Graduation afternoon, which was extremely popular last year. Plus lots of other opportunities across other year groups. All notifications surrounding these key dates will be sent by class teacher/phase leads, some of which will appear on the newsletter itself but also please keep an eye on SCOPAY.



We also would like to remind our Year 5 parents that the final date for booking a place on the Barnstondale Residential in Autumn 2024 is fast approaching. We will send out a reminder and reach out to those who have not yet confirmed in the first couple of weeks after half-term, in case anyone has changed their mind and would like to have their name down. We still have places left that we can offer based on the initial interest shown. Parents can still pay this off on SCOPAY in instalments if they wish to do so rather than having a lump sum at the end.

There was a delightful turn out in green to support our mental health and wellbeing week. There are more photos and details about this later in the newsletter, however it was great to see the Overleigh Community once again demonstrating their togetherness behind such a worthy campaign.



School has also been full of delicious looking cakes today ready for our PTA cake sale. Thank you to everyone who has contributed through either baking cakes or buying them to help raise funds. Ziggy has had an eye on them all day!

Can we please remind everyone of the importance of conforming with school uniform expectations in Summer Term. This relates not just to tops, shirts, shorts, trousers, skirts and dresses but also to footwear. It is essential that footwear follows the school uniform policy as this is an area that sometimes slips in the Summer Term with a particular reminder that trainers are not acceptable.

Attendance continues to be a major focus in education. This week we had our register attendance inspector in school, who informed us of areas that we must focus on to improve areas of attendance.



ATTENDANCE WORKS

Firstly, LATE ARRIVALS were highlighted as a key area.

There are a number of children who are still <u>persistently</u> late, including some children who have had over 40 late marks. We now have to record the reason if a child is late and this reason must come from the parent/carer who is dropping them off. Therefore, if your child arrives at school after 8.50am in the new half-term, or thereafter, then the adult accompanying them to school must ENTER THE INFORMATION into the screen in the main school entrance.

Anyone arriving at school after 9.00am will be recorded as 'U' for unauthorised and if there are 10 or more 'Us' in a consecutive period, then this can lead to financial penalties. We have been advised that we must issue these from next half-term where applicable.

So please remember, the advice given today:

- School opens at 8.40am
- Registration is taken at 8.50am. After this your child is late.
- After 8.50am the adult accompanying the child to school must supply a reason for the child being late. This must be entered in the screen in the main office area and the child will be marked as late.
- If your child arrives at school after 9.00am then this has to be marked as unauthorised.
- 10 or more unauthorised in a consecutive period of time can lead to a financial penalty being applied.

If you know that you are arriving late every day, then please try your best to alter your morning routine to allow for that extra time to not impact on school attendance.

If there is good reason for your child arriving late then please provide evidence (ie:- medical appointment card) of this or let the school know the day before where possible.

Secondly, there are still a number of children with VERY LOW ATTENDANCE

There are still a number of children whose attendance is considerably below national expectation. Please remember that we cannot authorise holidays in the school term time and that we are obliged to inform you of attendance that is falling below expected. Again, this can lead to financial penalty. Please help us to avoid this and work with us to improve your child's attendance.

<u>Lastly</u>, we are extremely grateful that the vast majority of our children have '0' late marks and are at least matching good attendance expectations. Thank you for this and for your support in ensuring that this is a consistent factor for your child.



Overleigh has been very lucky to have a lot of children join us during the last half-term or so, many who have moved into our community. They have all settled in beautifully and we have been delighted with the impact they have made. Welcome to Overleigh and long may you remain with us.

Unfortunately, we also have a few children who are leaving us to return to other countries during the half-term. They have all been an absolute credit to our school and their new schools are so lucky to be having them join. We wish these children and their families all the very best of luck for the future and you know that you will always be in our hearts at Overleigh.



We hope that everyone has a lovely, peaceful break, that the sun shines and that you all arrive back at school safely on Tuesday 4th June.

Our school 'Wellbeing Warriors' helped to collect donations and have lots of ideas for resources to buy for school. Thank you for your support!




























We made a model of a flower and labelled the parts and how they were important for the life cycle of a plant.
