her maternity leave next week, although she has already been spending time supporting the office and wider school in her recent visits.

Mrs Dalgarno, teacher, will be leaving us at the end of term along with Miss Jephcott and Miss Kelly. Miss Madrell and Miss May, who have been with us for the majority of the year, will be taking up teaching posts in new schools in September.

Mrs Flanagan, who is currently teaching in Y6, is also leaving Overleigh and will take up a new teaching post in September.

However, the year is far from over for all our learners and we have been extremely impressed with the determination and enthusiasm with which children are tackling their work and wider opportunities over this term. We have been busy putting together a 12 by 12 offer that will allow our children to track their achievement against the offer and set targets for themselves. These are key opportunities which we hope that all children will have been offered, and hopefully accepted, at least once by the time they leave Overleigh for high school, if they have had a full cycle of life through the school. - · Be a leader.
- Participate in competitive activities.
- · Grow produce to eat and share.
- Spend a night away from home.
- Understand how to navigate a museum, art gallery and city and cross the border into Wales!

Thank you to all the staff who have been running their lunchtime clubs this year. It has especially supported children who may not have outside clubs and opportunities and for children to explore new interests. Welsh Club with Mrs Birchall has been a real hit along with Dodgeball with Mrs McFaul. Mr Flynn and I have enjoyed learning alongside gardening club. Neither of us are experts but, together with the children, we have proved you can learn new skills on the job! It is wonderful to be harvesting the fruits of our labour and sharing them with the wider school. So far we have provided lettuce for the salad bar and picked and cooked the first of our peas. Early potatoes, more salad leaves and edible flowers should be on the table before the end of term. Later in the newsletter are some photos of the club.

Next week, we are having our annual Healthy & Safe week where we have a special focus on keeping our bodies, minds and community, safe and healthy. There are lots of special activities and experiences planned, which are targeted at specific age groups and for example, covering water safety, sun safety and fostering healthy relationships. Y5 have started slightly ahead of everyone by starting Bikeability this week.



We would like to remind you that school finishes for the year on Tuesday 23rd July at 2.15pm. As we have an early finish, so we ask if you could please ensure THAT YOU DO NOT COME TO THE OFFICE EVEN EARLIER THAN THAT TO ASK FOR YOUR CHILDER. We understand emergency situations can arise but it has become habitual for some families to collect their children early on Fridays or the last day of term. This means the office team are taken away from their most demanding duties with a constant flow of going to classes and collecting children. Unless you are able to provide an appointment card we are sorry but we cannot facilitate early collection. It is not appropriate to inconvenience school staff and your children's class mates to ensure an early get away to the caravan or for a weekend trip.

Thank you to everyone who follows the school opening and closing routines punctually every day it is very much appreciated!!!

Later in the newsletter you will find photographs of our music festival, held this week for all children to enter. In total we had 120 entries from groups or individuals and every class participated as a whole group too. It was a wonderful event and an opportunity to celebrate the wonderful talent and enthusiasm we have at Overleigh. Many congratulations to all the children who were invited to perform again after school to their parents and staff and to the overall winner Ben in Year 2, who captivated us with his solo performance of *I vow to thee my country*. Special thanks to Miss Axam, our music subject lead, who organised and managed the whole day and provided such inspiration and enjoyment for us all.



Our sports day mornings have been another highlight of the last few weeks. We were very lucky to have to beautiful weather and have the problem of how to provide shade and make sure everyone had suncream that week, rather than have to dodge the rain as in previous years. Thank you to everyone who attended and cheered on all the participants. We enjoyed the opportunity to see so many of you able to come and share the occasion. The children were absolutely brilliant



demonstrating co-operative teamwork skills during the team events, as well as sportsmanship and a healthy competitive attitude, during individual sprints. - The year group with the most sponsorship in each Key Stage (EYFS/KS1 and KS2) will win an ice cream from the ice cream van!


The ice cream vans will be staying until after school, so there is opportunity to purchase an ice cream if you didn't win one.







represented Overleigh brilliantly.










