Attendance

This week awards were presented for outstanding and excellent attendance. Well done to





everyone for your determination to be punctual and attend every day.

Attendance and Punctuality 24-25

As we have mentioned previously, the systems for monitoring and holding families to account for maintaining excellent attendance and punctuality have been tightened up considerably by the Department for Education. We are unable to authorise ANY term time travel abroad or holi-



days. Please do not abuse staff regarding these rules, they are what we have to follow. Therefore please be very careful to book time away in the school breaks. The breaks and Inset days are included again below to help you in this. We also strongly advise that you do not call in to report your child sick as you take them away on holiday. Children will usually let it slip and if not them their class mates, it is not a fair position to put children in and we have been instructed to not authorise the absence if there are strong grounds to suggest the child was on holiday.

Children are expected to be on site from 8.30am.

Doors open at 8.40am

Doors close at 8.50am and registration is completed.

Any child arriving after 8.50am is LATE and will need to be signed in at the school office by their parent.

If a child arrives from 9.00 onwards, they are late after the close of registration and receive a U mark in the register which counts as I absence.

Each 1/2 day or session missed is + 1 absence so a full day away from school counts as

2 absences.

Parents can currently be fined £60, rising to £120 if not paid within 21 days, for unauthorised absences. In September, this will increase for the first time since 2012 to £80 (rising to £160). The money from fines does not go to the school but instead goes to the Local Authority.

We will be required to consider fines when children miss more than five days - or 10 half -day "sessions" - at school in any 10-week period.

This would mean an unauthorised holiday or trip abroad lasting 2 weeks ie 10 school days, could mean 2 x £80 fines per parent which would amount to £320. The fine would be for each child, so a family with 2 children could be fined £640 for a 2 week break away. Also parents should note that if parents are separated both parents would still be fined even if only one determines to take the child away.

In the same way if a child is late after registration and receives a U mark on 10 occasions, the parent can also be fined.

Obviously it is a very punitive system and at Overleigh we would like to think we can support families to ensure excellent attendance for their child(ren). If you are having particular difficulty with punctuality or attendance in general do please contact our Attendance Champions: Mrs Redmayne, Mrs Martell and Miss Drew via the school office who are available to speak to in confidence and offer support where they can.

Our school website also has some helpful links and ideas that families may find useful.

UNIFORM

When getting ready for September, please remember we have a good stock of uniform that has been donated and is in good condition. Sweatshirts and cardigans with the logo are available from Uniformity in Handbridge but do remember plain red sweatshirts or cardigans from supermarkets are absolutely fine.

All children need to wear black school shoes—not trainers. We have a selection of spare shoes that any child wearing the incorrect footwear will be given instead.

Jewellery— Please remember that only a watch and one set of stud earrings are permitted for school. Children cannot wear watches or earrings for PE, including swimming, so they need to be able to remove these for themselves. We cannot just put plaster over them, therefore the best time to get ears pierced is over the summer break so they can remove them when they return to school.

Pencil Cases and Toys—Children do not need to bring these to school, instead keep them safely at home to enjoy. We provide all the pens and pencils they will need.

School Bags / PE kits—Please send your child with their PE kit on the first day of term in a <u>small draw string bag</u>. They should have a white T shirt, with or without the logo, black shorts and pumps or trainers. They can also have black jogging bottoms for the colder months. Please do not send large back packs, there is no room for us to store them. Ideally, please leave your child's PE kit in school for the half term and then take home to wash in the break so they always have it when needed. PE is part of the curriculum and also a way for the children to support their physical health & wellbeing. Therefore children are expected to participate. If they forget their kit, we will provide them with a spare and if they cannot do PE they must have a note from a parent.



SNACK

We have taken the difficult decision to stop serving a break time snack option. This is because, while we try and keep a healthy option in the items sold at school, it is impossible to them monitor the range of snacks children bring from home. Over this last year we have had a large number of children bringing sharing sized packets of crisps, packets of biscuits, chocolate bars and highly sugared cereal bars. As well as children raiting their lunchboxes. Therefore, although we understand there will be some disappointment we will cease school

snack and revert to our pre Covid FRUIT ONLY break time option. This means KSI & EYFS receive free fruit option every day and KS2 may bring a piece of fruit from home to enjoy.

On the odd occasion a family have had a home emergency and there has not been time for breakfast, we are able to provide some toast if you let us know as your child arrives.

Phones / Walking Home without Parents

As children reach upper KS2, you may decide they can walk home without you. In which case you need to send written permission to school to allow us to release them at the end of the day. If they walk to and or from school without a parent, they may bring a mobile to school to provide added safety for you / them. However, they must turn their phone off as they arrive in the playground, having sent agreed message to yourselves, and hand it in to the class teacher who will keep it until the end of the day. Again, you need to inform the class teacher you will allow your child to bring their phone and that you understand it is at your own risk and not covered by our school insurance.

Other children who are allowed phones on the way to school should hand them to their parents as they enter the school grounds.



Our first day back, Tuesday 3rd September, we will be focusing on our Christian Value of Love. For the remainder of the week are are using an Oliver Jeffers book to theme our PSHE and start of year learning.

We have previously enjoyed using other books by this author. They are often full of messages and challenge about the way we choose to lead our lives and are always beautifully illustrated. Begin Again, is no

exception. It will help us reflect on and plan to begin a new school year with positive intent where we all are mindful of others and are READY, RESPECTFUL & SAFE.

At the start of the book Oliver Jeffers has chosen a wonderful quote from Mary Oliver that we also plan to use as a reoccurring theme for the year ahead.

It is such a privilege to work with children during their time with us and see them grow emotionally and academically as well as physically! Their lives are very precious to us all and we look forward to another year of exciting planning ahead!

As well as wishing some staff goodbye we also have a number of children moving across the city or beyond and wish them and their families all the best. As we like to say, once you have been part of the Overleigh family, you are always part of us!


